Dear St Luke's family,

This Sunday at both of our services we begin a new sermon series on Paul's first letter to the church in Thessalonica, which he and his co-workers had planted. The letter conveys Paul's thankfulness and affection for the Thessalonian Christians, and speaks of how the gospel of Jesus Christ had impacted them profoundly, both with words and in the power of the Holy Spirit. As a result they had turned to follow God and were persevering in faith, love and hope, even in the face of opposition. There is lots we can learn from the church in Thessalonica and from the guidance Paul gives them in this letter. As we read and reflect on 1 Thessalonians, may we also be impacted by God's word and by the work of God's Spirit in our lives and in our church.
