Dear St Luke's family,

This Sunday, may we go beyond the familiar images of palm crosses. In fact, the account of Jesus entering Jerusalem in Luke's gospel doesn't actually mention palm branches at all! Jesus arrived in Jerusalem not with a display of power, but in humility, riding on a donkey. He knew he was heading towards the cross, where he would fight and win a victory for us – not one of military might, but one of pain and sacrifice. The kingdom of King Jesus is different to the kingdoms of the world, and King Jesus calls us to follow him in the way of humility, just as he called the first disciples. They praised God with shouts of 'Hosanna' – meaning 'Save us!' – and it is by Jesus's victory on the cross that we too have been saved. So we have good reason to sing our praises to him today!
