Dear St Luke's family,

Last Sunday, I went to a celebration for 20 years of Faithworks. They started when a group received a legacy for a decent sum of money. When they looked at their bank account they had some small savings already. The elders prayed and decided to give the money to the council to provide support to local people. This year through Faithworks, 9,000 people used a food bank voucher, £400,000 of debt relief was found for people struggling, 24 people found a new secure home, and 2 people moved from homelessness into an apprenticeship with Sunseeker. In a society that so often asks "How can you prove you deserve our help?", or "How do I know I can trust you to earn this?" How wonderful that we instead know a God who tells us "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others", and that when we do so "such sacrifices are pleasing to God".
