## This week we are praying for Open Doors – Praying for Persecuted Women

"For as woman came from man, so also man is born of a woman. But everything comes from God." 1 Cor 11:12. In many parts of the Middle East, girls are often seen as inferior to boys. Women and girls are often denied education and career opportunities. Many women face violence and oppression while others struggle with feelings of worthlessness. Pray that they will discover their identity in Christ and know that they are valued by God. Pray for the safety of women who are at risk of losing everything because of their active Christian faith.
